Using research from school websites, information from in-person school visits or interviews and reflection on your own academic goals, write or type your answers to the following questions in the space provided below. (Fill out one questionnaire for each school.) Answer as accurately and in as much detail as possible. Incorporating the exact names of majors, professors, school newspapers and other details is crucial when trying to convey to a school why you would like to attend their institution in particular, so please pay close attention. Also, when in doubt, write more. The more information you bring to the table, the more tools you will have to craft robust, meaningful essays.

16. Are there other miscellaneous details you can think of that might be important to include? What does this school offer that no other schools have? Without thinking about it too hard, why do you really want to go to this school?
